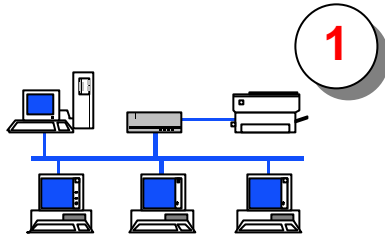


BASIC SKILLS TRAINING

The project offers literacy and numeracy training.



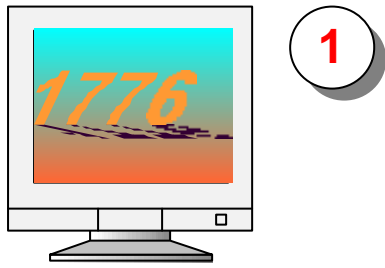
DEMOCRACY ONLINE

Discussion forums are created so that different interests in the community can air their views. Volunteers learn new skills by facilitating.



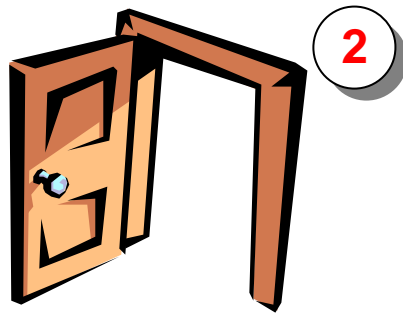
COMPUTER TRAINING

The center offers users a chance to gain qualifications.



LOCAL HISTORY ONLINE

Residents are able to develop Web pages with historic pictures, audio, drawn from local interviews and e-search.



GATEWAY WEBSITE

Local residents and businesses participate in developing a web site reflecting local interests, information and business.



LOCAL ARTS PROJECT

Residents and local groups can use multi-media facilities to develop their own creative projects.



E-MAIL FOR ALL

Everyone is given an email account which they can access from public facilities or elsewhere.



REVENUE PROJECTS

The project develops a number of projects—some with local businesses—aimed at generating income.



ONLINE LEARNING

Certificated courses are developed with the local college, providing progression through to higher level qualifications.
